

BFN helping lead Downtown NB






- Trina MacDonald, BFN's GM has been President of DNB for the past 5 years and has been working with their executive to secure funds for BIAs in the Province.
- In 2023, DNB was successful in signing an MOU securing \$1 Million for Capital Projects, Events, and Planning Projects for BIAs in NB.
- The DNB Investment Initiative Heart of our Communities was rolled out in May 2023 and all 24 BIAs in NB were able to access funding for investment

BFN DOLLARS

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- ➤ BFN invested \$17,590 in our BFN Dollar Sales, offering a 20% discount on the dollars, selling a total of \$88,050 in total to help local businesses.
- ➢ BFN partnered with City Tourism and provided \$1,598 in discounts and \$15,980 dollars in total were sold to City Tourism for their support local efforts.
- Discounts are expensed in BFN Advertising budget.
- A total of \$108,250 BFN Dollars were sold by BFN in 2023



BFN Façade Grant Program





- In 2023 BFN invested \$4050 in Grant Funding which leveraged \$305,000 in property upgrades and investments. Including a full revitalization of 127 Main Street.
- ▶3 locations received grants from \$1,000 to \$2,000.
- These investments result in increases in property assessments which in turn benefit the City of Fredericton through increased tax revenue.



BFN committed to Beautification








- BFN maintain a commitment to beautification which represented a \$1,000 investment in plant materials.
- BFN hired 2 students for the Clean Team to pick up garbage, record graffiti, pull weeds and maintain planters, as well as host our concert series.
- Our Clean Team staff represented an \$8,900 investment by BFN.
